- Come early. Popular items such as seasonal fruit, often sell out quickly.
- If you see unfamiliar produce, feel free to ask the farmer how to store, prepare, and eat it.
- Bring a cooler for your purchases if you won't be returning home quickly or if you plan to purchase meat.
- Strike up a conversation with the vendors so you get to know them and they get to know you!

Tips for having a successful on farm u-pick experience



- Do not drive or walk in areas not intended guests. Be aware that there may be heavy equipment, animals, and other hazards on site.
- Please call ahead or check farm website to ensure availability of fruit as the season differs year to year.
- Wear sturdy shoes and dress for the weather. You will be outside possibly in hot, humid, or drizzly conditions. Be prepared by wearing appropriate clothing and closed toe shoes.
- Weather changes frequently so stay up to date prior to your visit and call ahead if storms are anticipated to determine if the u-pick operation will stay open.
- Do not bring dogs. The farm you are visiting may have other animals and dogs can pose an additional hazard. If you do require a service animal, be sure to call ahead so accommodations can be made.
- Bring cash or checks. Because most u-pick operations do not take credit or debit cards, you need to be prepared to pay using cash or check.
